

A few college internships and close encounters with bodily fluids confirmed that being a healthcare provider was not for her. That realization prompted her to discover how her passion for person-centered care could be fulfilled without being at the bedside. At that same

time, she was involved in navigating care for her grandmother who lived in a different state. Her family brought on a care manager, Pam, who changed Ashley's experience with aging and end of life care. Thus a deep interest and passion for care management was born.

Ashley is a graduate of Santa Clara University where she got her Bachelors in Biology and Gerontology and a current graduate student at USC's School of Gerontology where she is pursuing her Master's in Aging Services Management - she will graduate in July. She is launching the Wood River Valley's first Geriatric Care/Aging Services Management business this May where she is excited to begin her work helping older adults and their families navigate aging and end of life.
